






NATIVE & ORNAMENTAL ALTERNATIVES

German Statice Ganiolimon tataricum

Prickly heads of tiny white flowers. Low rosettes of leathery green leaves. Branching heads of flowers bloom July - August. For rock gardens, xeriscaping, edging or containers. Excellent as fresh or dried flowers. Popular for wreaths. Attracts butterflies. CAUTION: All plant parts poisonous if eaten. Zone 3



Common Yarrow @ Achillea millefolium

Herbaceous perennial with broad, flattened heads of flowers and feathery leaves. Commercial varieties with varying flowe colours are also available. Zone 3



Russian Sage Salvia yangii

Upright bush. Fragrant, grey-green foliage. Lavender blue blossoms. Flowers July to October. Good for cut flowers/dry arrangements. Attracts butterflies. Zone 4



ALSO CONSIDER: Meadow Rue varieties (Thalistrum delayout) Zone 3; Narrow-leaved Meadowsweet (Spirgeo albo DuRpi yar, albo) Tone 3; Pearly Everlasting (Anaphalis margaritaceo) Tone 3

- While they may spread a little, they are quite different from Campanula rapunculoides (Creeping bellflower) which is the only species of Campanula that is a noxious weed.




