Albertan

The Agricultural Pests Act 1941

- Authorizes the Minister of Agriculture to designate as a pest any animal that is likely to destroy crops or livestock
- Every person and every municipality has to destroy and prevent the establishment of designated pests
- Has allowed for Alberta to remain "Rat Free"



Pests

Must be controlled

- Norway rat and other rat species or strain derived from the genus Rattus
- Wild boar, when at large



Nuisances


May be controlled

- Coyotes
- Richardson's ground squirrel
- Skunk
- Deer mouse
- House mouse
- Northern pocket gopher
- Magpie

Rural Infestations








Urban

African Soft Fur Rats


- Part of mouse family











Species Identified - 2023
