Terrestrial Technician - Invasive Species (Seasonal)

The Invasive Species Technician (seasonal) is responsible for assisting with communications, assisting with AISC project implementation, and the biocontrol release program.

Key responsibilities include:

- Assisting with the collection and release of insect biological control agents.
- Assisting with program delivery for AISC’s new and existing outreach programs.
- Revising and editing new and existing content.
- Revising and adhering to AISC’s OH&S program.
- Assisting other AISC staff with all aspects of AISC operations.

Successful candidates will have:

- Education in a related field (agriculture, biology, ecology, or environmental sciences).
- Excellent writing, editing, communication and time management skills.
- Experience conducting fieldwork and handling insects.
- Experience in communications and public engagement.
- Strong digital literacy.
- Knowledge of invasive species and their impacts.
- Valid Standard First Aid and a valid Driver’s Licence.
- Ability to work some weekends and overtime as some work is weather dependent.

This is a full-time, seasonal position with possibility of extension (4 months: May through August with anticipated start date of May 4th, 2026) and will involve both remote field and office work. The successful candidate will be expected to provide a home office. Compensation is \$25/hour for 37 hours per week with no benefits. **The successful candidate must be located within Lethbridge.**
